# HYDEE FELDSTEIN SOTO

Hydee Feldstein Soto is the 43rd Los Angeles City Attorney. She is the City's general counsel and serves as legal advisor to the Mayor, City Council, and the hundreds of boards, departments, officers and entities that make up the City of Los Angeles. Feldstein Soto was born and raised in San Juan, Puerto Rico, and moved to the U.S. to attend Swarthmore College and then Columbia University School of Law. After law school, she moved to Los Angeles, which she has called home for more than 40 years.

## **ARIEL FAN**

Ariel Fan is Founder and CEO of GreenWealth Energy, a leading developer of EV charging for commercial, multifamily, and fleet buildings across California. Fan founded the company in 2016 after being awarded Southern California Edison's Energy Efficiency Award for capturing the most public funding for green building upgrades among 15 million electric utility customers. GreenWealth is certified as the first woman minority-owned energy company in California, working with clients such as the Walt Disney Company, the City of LA, SoCalGas, and national real estate companies to transition to a zero-emissions future. A climate advocate, Fan lives in Pasadena and serves on two boards, E2 (Environmental Entrepreneurs) and US Green Building Council LA.



Founded in 1986, MOSTe provides workshops on college access, personal development and career exploration. Scholars are matched with professional female mentors for support and guidance on their journey. We lead local and long-distance college tours, and offer individual college application support and financial aid counseling. We have served over 2,000 girls through our comprehensive college and career access program.



### **Colleges** Attended

MOSTe scholars have graduated from all UC and many CSU campuses, as well as from private colleges including Brown, Bryn Mawr, Kenyon, Lycoming, Mount Holyoke, Penn, Smith, Tulane, and Yale.

MOSTe recruits student sfrom six Title I middle schools, serving nearly 200 girls from 6th grade through college in the Los Angeles area each academic year.
